





<u>Clouds</u>—kinds of clouds and what they are made of, function of clouds, extra info at back

<u>Rain</u>—clouds develop, rain drops form and fall, plants and animals drink, puddles dry into the (intro to water cycle), more info at back <u>Rainbow</u>—how they form, colors, shape, more info at back
