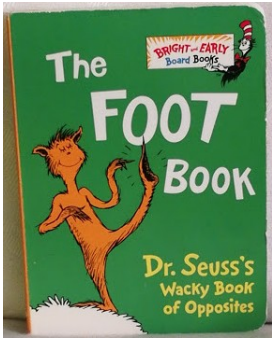
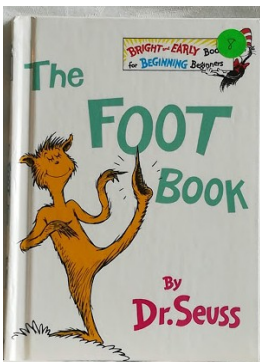


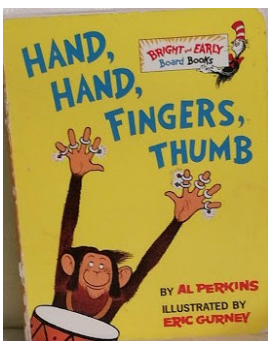
Books to Check Out—bodies



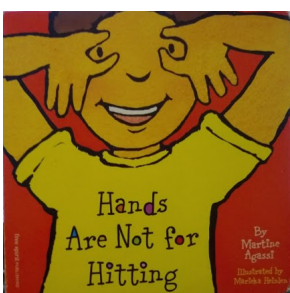
Board Book—opposites and feet. Simple rhyming text.



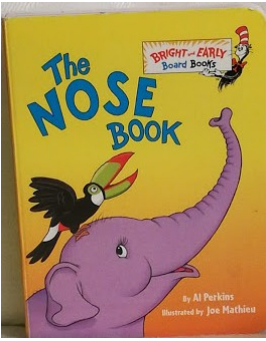
Not a Board Book—opposites and feet. Simple rhyming text. DRA reading level 8, first grade, but don't wait until then to enjoy the rhythm, rhyme, and imagination.



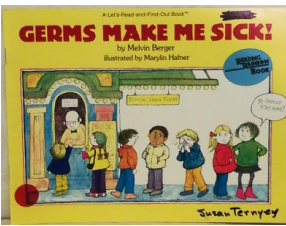
Board Book—highly rhythmic and rhyming, simple compelling text. Musical monkeys.



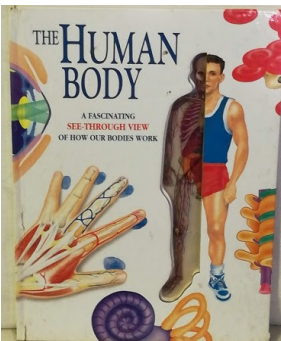
Board Book—simple text, mostly one or two words per page, large font. Appealing illustrations on double page spreads. Suggestions for parents and caregivers at the end. Other books in the series on back cover.



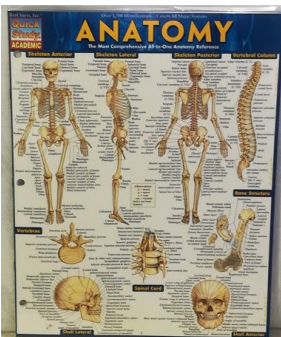
Board Book—all kinds of animal noses, their functions, and postulates, What if we didn't have noses? Simple rhyming text. Engaging illustrations.



May be summarized for young learners with limited attention span and understanding. Conversation starter for washing hands, covering coughs, not sharing drinks and utensils (cups and combs—not necessarily sharing germs, but other undesirables) . . . changing socks and underwear daily, etc.



Can be used as a browsing or reference book for young children.



Tri-folding Anatomy chart has skeleton, muscles, blood and heart, etc . . . the early learner doesn't need to memorize all the details, but can be familiar with what a skeleton looks like, and how muscles move our skeletons/bodies, etc. Choose what's appropriate.
