Cloth or paper fishing pond. Attach paperclips to noses of cloth or paper fish; attach a magnet to the end of a string. For young children the pole is just too difficult to use.

15 minutes roll, calendar, weather, today's schedule/topic See lesson 1.

15 minutes Scripture story:

Gen. 1:20-23—at the words "abundantly" and "multiply" have the children raise their hands; hand out fish crackers or gummy fishes.

"And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl [birds] that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven [the sky].

Snack while reading book(s):

Fish crackers or gummy fish.

5 minutes Book(s):

Give each child a picture book about whales/dolphins/fish. All wait until the word "Go" to open them. No turning pages until the leader counts to 5. Count to 5, then say, "Turn the page". All must turn the page. Have extra books in case some children's books are shorter. Allow/encourage children to marvel aloud over the pictures in their books.

Alternatively, each child could have 30 seconds or a minute or two to peruse his/her book, then pass them all left (or right), until everyone has had a chance to look at each book.




10 minutes Science Activity:


10 minutes Science Activity:

On a paper make a T chart. Label one side "fish", the other side "non-fish". Deal the sea creatures cards out to the children. Each child in turn puts a card either on the side of fish, or non-fish. Talk about the usual characteristics of fish: fins, scales, gills...

15 minutes free play:

Optional: some children really enjoy card games, such as Concentration ("What Did You See in the Sea?"), Go Fish, Snap Fish, or others. If you use the sea creature cards following, either print them on card stock and laminate, or mount them on construction paper and laminate.







Let the children carry toy or boiled eggs in spoons from one end of the room or yard to the other—trying not to drop them.

15 minutes roll, calendar, weather, today's schedule/topic See lesson 1.

15 minutes Scripture story:

Gen. 1:20-23—--at the words "abundantly" and "multiply" have the children raise their hands; hand out "bird egg" candies.

"And God said, Let the waters bring forth abundantly the moving creature that hath life, and fowl [birds] that may fly above the earth in the open firmament of heaven [the sky].

To make page 14 of the <u>Creation Days</u> booklet, print the page (which follows) on blue paper. Let the children finger paint the green and brown for the tree (finger prints make a leafy-looking tree). Add 2-3 bird stickers.

5 minutes Song:

"In the Leafy Treetops" (Children's Songbook, p. 240)
For a visual aid, make a poster similar to p. 14 of the <u>Creation Days</u> booklet, adding a sun and some nodding flowers. You may also use conversation bubbles to show the birds singing "Good morning", and the flowers saying "How do you do?" "How do you do today?". To involve the children, you may let them take turns pointing appropriately as you sing (especially if they have a "conductor's baton" to point with). Alternatively, paper plates with pictures for the words, or flannel board and figures could involve the children as each can be in charge of the picture/figure for a certain part of the song.

5 minutes Movement:

Bird hop—frontwards, backwards, side to side, up and down a step or two.

15 minutes free play:

Hide and seek toy or boiled egg(s). One/some children hide the egg (s) for the others to find, then switch turns.

Snack while reading book(s):

Chicken nuggets.

(Emphasize the short e sound in nest, and egg—be careful not to pronounce short e egg as a long a. You may note that often we are somewhat sloppy with the way we pronounce things, which can make it hard for others, especially those learning our language, to understand what we are saying. It will also help us learn to spell easier if we pronounce words correctly).

15 minutes Art:

Color eggs. Cut egg cartons into 4 -6 egg carriers for the children to take home their prize work.
