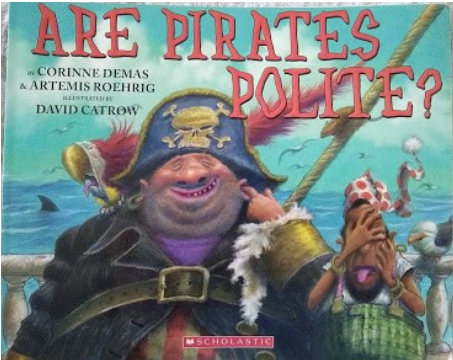
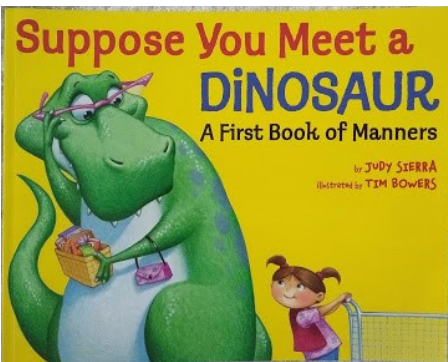


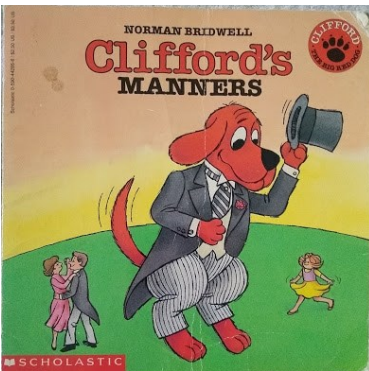
Books to Check Out—manners, social skills



Teaching manners with the most unlikely crew—"Pirates are unruly and pirates love to fight, but pirates still say 'please' and 'thanks' 'cause pirates are polite." Rhyming, humorous, large text. Engaging illustrations. Lots of details to notice. Read aloud. 12 points of politeness summarized at the end.



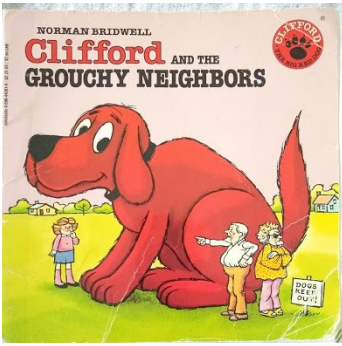
Brief rhyming text in large font, politeness words in bold. Fun art in various perspectives.



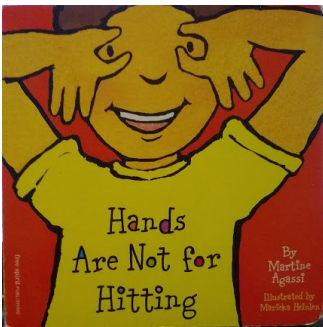
Read aloud. Each page has 2-3 lines of story, and a short summary of the rule. Loveable Clifford teaches with humor. One of many Clifford stories.



Scholastic Reader Level 1. Simple words and short sentences for the newest readers. Alfie thinks of creative ways to get a cookie—Mommy asks, Can you think of a better way to get a cookie? Ask politely!



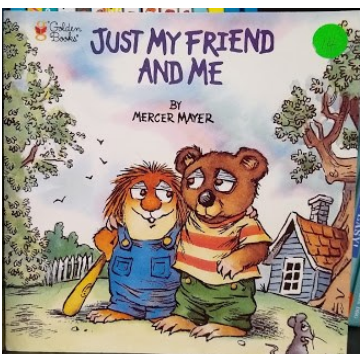
Read aloud. A few lines of text each page. Inevitably neighbors can have disputes—this book shows that there are two sides to the story. And in the end, they were able to make peace, through Clifford’s thoughtfulness. One of many titles in the Clifford series.



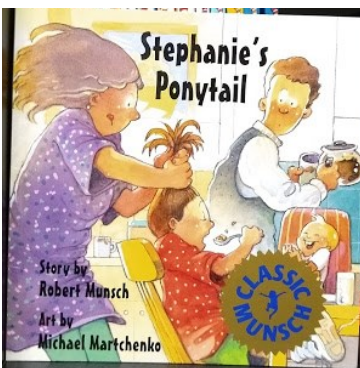
Board Book—simple text, mostly one or two words per page, large font. Appealing illustrations on double page spreads. Suggestions for parents and caregivers at the end. Other books in the series on back cover.



Simple limited text in large font, nicely illustrated. Social skills for primary grades. Ideas at the back for reinforcing skills. Also an illustrated list of other titles in the series.



A Little Critter book addressing the challenges of friendship. Lots of things to talk about being friends. Simple limited text in large font. Read aloud for young children, DRA reading level 14, 1st grade.



Read aloud. Stephanie tries to be original, only to be copied again and again by the others at school. She finally tricks them into not copying her. Whether you agree with her solution, it’s good to talk about!
