

Books to Check Out—ABCs




Alliteration and the delightful illustrations of Sandra Boynton.




Simple alliterative text, and entertaining illustrations. Lots of opportunity for commentary/discussion.




One of many Animal Alphabet books. Large book, beautiful, realistic artwork, wordless (last page gives the words).




Capital and lower case letters, and one sample word with picture on each page. Sesame Street characters. Lots of opportunity for language/discussion.




Read aloud, goes through the alphabet 4 times, with healthy food, bad behavior, yucky food, and good behaviors. Reading level 16 (1st to 2nd grade).




Read aloud, goest through the alphabet twice, with things to play and places to go. By the author of <u>Bad Kitty</u>.



Bilingual English/Spanish cognates. Capital and lower case letters, and one illustration each page.



Bilingual ABC book—English/Sign language. Sesame Street characters. Photo illustrations. "Designed for the very young . . . Each letter appears in both capital and lower case on a single page, along with a photo of Bove showing the sign for the letter, and clearly labeled photos of her signing words or sentences featuring that letter. A good companion to the author's Sesame Street Sign Language Fun."--School Library Journal.



For flying fans . . . Airplane Alphabet. Explanatory text would need to be summarized for young children.

Alphabetical exploration of trees—their leaves, their shape and size (compared to silhouette people). Some showing flowers, fruits. Excellent springboard to dive into leaf gathering walks, leaf/flower pressing, and multitudinous tree experiences. A good follow-up would be <u>The Giving Tree</u>.
